THE MHSCA 2023 Hall of Fame inductees: **Daniel Barry** has coached ice hockey for twenty-five years. University Liggett High School as the varsity head coach from 1997



-2002. Then in 2002, he was hired as the varsity head coach at De La Salle Warren, where he coached for the

next fourteen years. Dan's teams earned four Metro League Conference Championships (one as varsity assistant coach), six MHSAA Regional Championships, two Catholic League Championships (2008, 2010), four Final Four appearances, and two Michigan Interscholastic Hockey League Championships. Dan's teams accumulated over 300 wins, and while head varsity coach at De La Salle, his career win-loss record was 227-114-10.

David Jack Brinks : Grandville and Hudsonville



a diving coach for thirty-eight years and is still counting! He began his coaching career as the head varsity boys diving coach at Grandville High School in 1985 and continues as head coach there. These teams have produced twenty Conference Champions, ten Regional Champions, and fifteen All-State divers. During the same time span he also acted as the head varsity boys diving coach at Ottawa Hills High School for two years (1988-1990). These teams produced ten Conference Champions, five Regional Champions and nine All-State divers. From 2017 to the present Dave has also been the head varsity girls diving coach at Hudsonville High School. These teams have produced eight Conference Champions, five Regional Champions and ten All-State divers.


Bob Bruder Fenton Basketball







This can be at any level. You cannot however count more than one level or season for a sport in any one year.

For example, coaching both boys' and girls' basketball during the same school year counts as "1" year; coaching both 7th grade boys and JV boys during the same school year counts as "1" year.

Awards for 30 years and more will have the sports that the candidate coached listed on the plaque. The coach will be presented only one award for each level of service after 30 years.
