Baseball - Dave Elliott: No Report

Basketball – DID NOT ATTEND: No Report

Bowling - Dave Kowalski: 17th season as MHSAA sport. Oct 12 Clinic and Rules meeting. Division I hosted by Thunder Bowl in Allen Park – seats 440 in area.

Competitive Cheer – Anna Ramirez: Clinic in October – has about 500 members – finished 25th year. Looking at restructuring the qualifying process for the MHSAA

Football - Larry Merx: Resigned as Executive Director – new one is Al Slammer. Playoff process is being adjusted due to caliber of schedule in 2020. MHSAA agreed to lessen the amount of to the ground contact during the week to thirty minutes.

Golf - Debbie Williams-Hoak: MHSAA December – made changes with policies starting with the girls season. Allow the use of cell phones – coach, officials, live scoring and distance measuring. MHSAA create a 12 stroke maximum rule per hole – helps with pace of the game. Hopefully allow another two day options for MHSAA tournament play. All – state banquet soon. Coaches and athletes need to know the rules and are working on that process. The American Developmental Model – help to coach the youth. One problem rule – out of bounds – not to use rule of dropping the ball – local rule. **New MHSCA representative – Hugh Felt**

Gymnastics - John Cunningham: concern with coaches lasting in the sport and finding new coaches and judges to replace the older coaches that are getting out of the field. Seeing a growth and decline of teams. Coaches clinic in October, Judges Cup in November – allows for the training of judges – also lets the teams get evaluated and coaches and athletes get feedback.

Girls Lacrosse – DID NOT ATTEND: No Report

Men's Lacrosse – Mike Jolly: Lacrosse is continuing to grow, but the processes for recognition is being tested due to the larger numbers. Working through the process of being tax exempt. Changing fee levels. Seeding is still going on with the Lacrosse MHSAA.

Skiing - Sue Miller: October clinic – Regional and States tend to be run by the parents of communities and there has been discussions with the MHSAA to contract people to help out. Trying to work on middle school to increase state finals corresponding with the high school state finals.

Softball - Ted McIntyre: baseball and softball state tournaments were separated to help with the differences in the sport – especially boys pitch counts.

Swimming - Darrin Millar: clinic this past weekend. Concerns with the possible unethical behavior concerning the completion of all – state academic. State meets are a concern with finding the proper sites. The concern with the varying number of qualifiers from the different regional sites.

Tennis - Gary Ellis: founder of association Bob Wood passed away this past year. Still working on impact of change of sports calendar for boys. January – clinic. New site for state finals will be played at the University of Michigan. MHSAA granted coaches at sub-varsity can coach during the match.

Track and Field/Cross Country – Steve Porter: Issues with Regionals – especially division IV has low representation for full teams. CC Clinic November 9-10. Membership is improving. Kermit Ambrose 101 Club - raised \$9000 last year helped to provide transportation for CC All Star meet. Meet of Champions of CC and Track.

Volleyball - Jodi Manore: reaching higher with MHSAA event. Trying to help boys get started with the sport of volleyball.

Wrestling - Mark Holdren: The MWA is working with the MHSAA on developing a Girl's State Tournament process. Currently the MWA sponsors the tournament with the blessing of the MHSAA. There has been a concern with the number of forfeits that are currently occurring in dual meets in Michigan as well as throughout the nation. The NFHS has been considering reducing the number of weight classes.

- To receive specific certificates for a single sport the candidate must qualify for the specified number of years in that sport. This can be at any level. You cannot however count more than one level or season for a sport in any one year. For example, coaching both boys and girls basketball during the same school year counts as "1" year; coaching both 7th grade boys and JV boys during the same school year counts as "1" year.

Awards for 30 years and more will have the sports that the candidate coached listed on the plaque. The coach will be presented only one award for each level of service after 30 years.
