##### 700 ALL STATE AWARDS

700.10 Criteria for All State Player nomination: Only players on a MWLCA school/club in good standing are eligible for All State nomination.

Only performances during MHSAA Spring Season count toward stats 700.20 All State nominations must be submitted to the secretary by the Friday prior to the end of season meeting.

Nominations can be submitted through [mwlca.com](http://mwlca.com) or by downloading the form

and emailing 700.30 There will be an All-State 1st Team, 2nd Team and Honorable Mentions for both MHSAA Division I and II.

Each Division will nominate: 2 goalies, 4 defense, 8 attack/midfield players for first team.

2 goalies, 4 defense, 8 attack/midfield players for second team.

Each MWLCA school/club in good standing will have 18 votes. They will vote for 2 goalies, 4 defense, 8 attack/midfield and will have 4 at large votes.

The top 2 goalies will get 1st Team, the next 2 will get 2nd team.

The top 4 defense will get 1st Team, the next 4 will get 2nd team.

The top 8 attack/midfield will get 1st Team, the next 8 will get 2nd team.

Up to 16 players can be kept on 1st or 2nd teams if ties cannot be broken after 3 votes per Executive Committee approval.

The next 28 highest vote getters will earn All State Honorable Mention.

Up to 32 players can be kept on Honorable Mention if ties cannot be broken after 3 votes per Executive Committee approval.

700.40 Academic All-State Awards will be issued based on the guidelines established by US Lacrosse.

**Philosophy of Athletics**  
Athletics gives students a chance to become student athletics, which means athletics teaches athletes discipline, a strong work ethic, and cooperation with others.

Athletics teach athletes how to not only compete, but how to handle both winning and losing.

Coach Fredette believes that high school athletics should not be just a one sport athlete.

He believes that students who do athletics also excel academically in the classroom because of the discipline learned in sports.

He knows that students who play sports upon graduation are more prepared to face the challenges that life presents them.

While he always expects his players to work hard, he also wants his athletes to enjoy experiences on and off the courts.

His former players tell him how much they enjoyed competing and also how much fun they had on team trips, whether it was to play top competition across Michigan or on to Florida over Easter vacation.

Athletes learn how to compete, but they also gain friendships that last a lifetime, if only in their memories.

### **NFHS NATIONAL COTY WINNER**

Recipients must exemplify the highest standards of sportsmanship, ethical conduct and moral character, and be endorsed by their respective state high school associations.

Recipients are selected by the NFHS Coaches Association Awards Committee and approved by the NFHS Board of Directors

The NFHS, which has been recognizing coaches through an awards program since 1982, honors coaches in the top 10 girls sports and top 10 boys sports (by participation numbers), and in one "other" sport that is not included in the top 10 listings.

The NFHS also recognizes a spirit coach as a separate award category. Winners of NFHS awards must be active coaches during the year for which they receive their award.

The NFHS Coaches Association has an advisory committee composed of a chair and eight sectional representatives.

The sectional committee representatives evaluate the state award recipients from the states in their respective sections and select the best candidates for the sectional award in each sport category.

The NFHS Coaches Association Advisory Committee then considers the sectional candidates in each



sport, ranks them according to a point system, and determines a national winner for each of the 20 sport categories, the spirit category and one "other" category.

A total of 537 coaches will be recognized this year with state, sectional and national awards.

## MHSCA COACHING RECOGNITION for 15/20/25/30/35/40/45/50 Years

The candidate must have distinguished himself/herself with good coaching ethics and promoted good sportsmanship throughout his/her coaching career.

\*The AD or principal's signature confirms this.

Ten (10) years of coaching outside of Michigan may be applied to the application. Coaching at any level may be applied as long as it is a school sponsored interscholastic sport.

To receive a general coaching certificate the candidate

must have been coaching at least one sport per year at any level for the requested number of years.

To receive specific certificates for a single sport the candidate must qualify for the specified number of years in that sport.

This can be at any level. You cannot however count more than one level or season for a sport in any one year.

For example, coaching both boys and girls basketball during the same school

year counts as "1" year; coaching both 7th grade boys and JV boys during the same school year counts as "1" year.

Up to three (3) years may be included for active duty military service which delayed or interrupted an applicant's coaching career.

Awards for 30 years and more (plaque) will have the sports that the candidate coached listed on the plaque.

The coach will be presented only one award for each level of service after 30 years.

Additionally, one boy and one girl from each of the four classes of schools (A, B, C, D) receive a plaque as the MHSCA State Multi-Sport Athlete of the Year.
