REMEMBERING JACK JOHNSON Executive Director Emeritus 1928 - 2019

1928 - 2019

Jack Johnson, our Executive Director Emeritus passed away at the age of 90 years a short while ago.

For all of his professional life, Coach Johnson devoted himself tirelessly to kids and coaches. A pioneer-leader at all levels – local through national – he was especially instrumental in the growth and stature of the MHSCA.

For his young students and athletes at Dearborn High School, Coach was a larger than life role model.

More often than not, he was their favorite teacher and/or coach because he was steadfast in his encouragement, mentoring, and acknowledgement. Along the way, he and his kids garnered four state swim championships; and he was accorded numerous state and national honors.

Many students followed in his footsteps to become accomplished coaches and administrators just as he was.

A great role model, it was natural for youngsters to want grow

to be "just like Coach."

Well-trained to lead, Coach Johnson was an Eagle Scout who attended Michigan State Normal (now Eastern Michigan



University) and the University of Illinois.

He married his Fordson High School sweetheart, Dolores Kuciemba, and they soon became an anticipated welcoming sight at most state and national conventions.

They were consummate hosts to both old friends and colleagues as well as first-time attendees.

Jack and Dolores raised three

children in their loving Livonia home all the while he was juggling athletic director duties, coaching, teaching, officiating, and devoting significant time to the MHSCA and MIAAA.

Their family has grown to include five grandchildren and three great-grandchildren.

As Executive Director of the MHSCA, Jack Johnson greatly strengthened our coaches' ability to express their desires to the MHSAA and experience the satisfaction of those views being heard and respected.

He believed that communication was a primary factor in uniting our common coaching interests. He produced, published, and delivered the timely *MHSCA Newsletter* long before the ease of today's electronic writing, editing, and distribution via computers and the internet. He also labored for recognition of our deserving members through the *Coach of the Year* and *Hall of Fame* celebrations – both at the state and national levels.

The many benefits that we enjoy today are a result of his vision, initiative, and collaboration with others.

Jack Johnson's passing leaves a tremendous void in our ranks but the memory of his friendship and service to us remains as an inspiration – much like his students felt – for us to be like him.....even more.

Michigan High School Tennis Coaches Association



The Michigan High School Tennis Coaches Association (MHSTeCA) held its fall meeting on Saturday, October 26th at Haslett High School.

MHSAA Assistant Director, Dan Hutcheson, was present to give his report on several items of importance to the state and to the future of high school tennis. Items included an update on tennis reporting and new features being created by coaches and MHSAA for regional hosts and seed committees, reviewed the success rate of the state seed committee (97.6%), challenged the board to work toward growing the sport and reviewed information concerning the dates of the state finals and problems that exist with a Friday/Saturday tournament.

The MHSTeCA board will continue discussions on many of these

important issues.

The board made the following proposals and have forwarded them to the MHSAA tennis committee for consideration: the State Finals will be played on Friday and Saturday unless there are conflicts with the host facility, Finals Managers will distribute a different colored badge/wristband on the second day to two coaches to eliminate badge switching at the State Finals, spring regionals will be played on the Monday and Tuesday before Memorial Day with the area seed meeting to be scheduled on Wednesday evening and the state seed meeting on the Tuesday after Memorial Day, during the fall season host schools may schedule their regional tournament on any of the days from Wednesday through Saturday during the week of regionals, should the MHSAA determine that the number of regionals be reduced from eight, there will be three auto-

matic qualifiers from each regional to the State Finals with additional qualifiers advancing if 18 points are earned (9 or more schools) or 10 points (8 or fewer schools, individual competition limits will clearer guidelines, clarification of the substitution rule be omitted "after the regional lineup sheet has been received by the tournament manager," and allowing the #1 doubles finalists on a non-qualifying team to advance to the State Finals if their team's #1 singles player also qualifies.

This year's coach's clinic will be held for the second year at Hope College on January 24-25 2020.

It will provide an opportunity for on court demonstrations and activities and will attract many great guest speakers.


Three coaches will be inducted

into the MHSTeCA Hall of Fame as the Class of 2020 on January 24th in Holland. They are Tim Buck (Grandville), Cliff Perez (Ludington) and Chuck Reed (Whittemore-Prescott).

Coaches of the Year were chosen and All-State Athletes for the Boys Season were also decided at the fall meeting.

The next MHSTeCA board meeting will take place after the conclusion of the Girls Tennis season on Saturday, June 13th at Haslett High School



I am often asked by my students why they must learn history. I show

GENERAL REQUIREMENTS

- The candidate must have distinguished himself/herself with good coaching ethics and promoted good sportsmanship throughout his/her coaching career. *The AD or principal's signature confirms this.
- Ten (10) years of coaching outside of the state of Michigan may be applied to the application.
- Coaching at any level may be applied as long as it is a school sponsored interscholastic sport. A maximum of ten (10) years may be allowed for coaching at the collegiate level.
- To receive a general coaching certificate the candidate must have been coaching at least one sport per year at any level for the requested number of years.
- To receive specific certificates for a single sport the candidate must qualify for the specified number of years in that sport. This can be at any level. You cannot however count more than one level or season for a sport in any one year. For example, coaching both boys and girls basketball during the same school year counts as "1" year; coaching both 7th grade boys and JV boys during the same school year counts as "1" year.

Awards for 30 years and more will have the sports that the candidate coached listed on the plaque. The coach will be presented only one award for each level of service after 30 years.

The MHSCA Distinguished Service Award:

MHSCA recognizes individuals and organizations who have provided extraordinary service to educational athletics, the advancement student athletes, coaches, or those who serve interscholastic athletics through its Distinguished Service Awards.

The Distinguished Service Award (DSA) is given to a person (or persons), either volunteer or staff, who have exhibited valuable professional service (within the MHSCA or among its association membership) including academically, supportive, service, or assistance distinction at any level of interscholastic athletics. These criteria are good measures of acceptable candidates and help to assure that recipients have a wide range of "service" that they provide to the profession of interscholastic athletics. Nominations should be submitted on an individual basis, not by a group or on behalf of constituent groups (conferences, affiliates, assemblies, committees, etc.).

The MHSCA Distinguished Service Award does not need to be awarded each year. This award should be bestowed only when the MHSCA Board of Directors committee decides that nominations warrant presentation of the award. This award may be given posthumously.

Why nominate a deserving candidate for the MHSCA Distinguished Service Awards:

- To recognize person who has positively impacted interscholastic athletics in a significant way;
- To recognize institutions for their affiliation with individuals who demonstrate the highest level of professionalism and commitment to interscholastic athletics;
- To confirm and honor a superior servant by his/her peers and colleagues;
- To celebrate individuals who epitomize the profession's highest standards for interscholastic sports;
- To focus attention on the exemplary, and by doing so to elevate the profession overall and establish a high standard of excellence in promoting, supporting or contributing to interscholastic athletics;
