## The Rich Tompkins Multi-Sport Athletic Award 2022-23 STATE WINNERS

The Michigan High School Coaches Association (MHSCA), the professional organization of high school coaches and athletic directors, is announcing eight Senior Athletes from around the state as the MHSCA's Rich Tompkins Multi-Sport Athlete Award winners.

The Rich Tompkins Multi-Sport Athletic Award provides an opportunity to recognize student athletes who have excelled in a variety of athletic, academic, school and community endeavors. Only student athletes who participated in a minimum of three seasons of interscholastic athletics in each of four years are considered for the award can be nominated by their school administration.

Award winners are determined by earning the most points as established through a rubric which includes athletic accomplishments, athletic leadership, school involvement, academic achievements, as well as, community involvement.

In 2023 there were 110 nominees for the award. All nominees will receive a certificate recognizing their accomplishments. The eight winners representing a boy and a girl from each class receive a plaque.

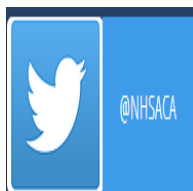

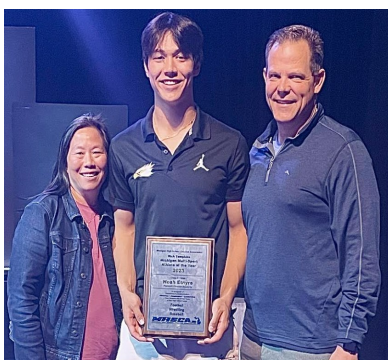

# Michigan Interscholastic Volleyball Coaches Association

The Michigan Interscholastic Volleyball Coaches Association has over 1200 members, consisting of 450+ head coaches, HS assistants, MS coaches, ADs, HOF honorees, and an increasing number of Boys' Volleyball Coaches.

Members are eligible for several honors including Hall of Fame recognition, nomination for MHSCA, NFHS, and NHSACA Coach of the Year (COTY), Region COTYs at the varsity, sub-varsity and MS levels, Final Four COTYs, and Coach of the Week.

If their coaches are MIVCA members, player awards include "Ms. Volleyball", Team and Individual Academic All-State certificates, 608 All-Region players named, 228 All-State honorees, Grants and Scholarships, and Final 4 pins. In addition 32 Michigan

coaches and 73 athletes received national recognition through our affiliation with the American volleyball Coaches Association (AVCA).

MIVCA has begun the process of updating our charter to ensure that it provides for the best organizational structure, functions, procedures and wording to reflect changes we have made (website, social media, etc.), and will be making with the growth of Boys Volleyball.

We want to improve the representation across the state and increase the opportunities for our membership coaches to be involved in leadership and service roles in our association.

A survey will be sent out to members for their feedback and to indicate their interest in serving on a committee.

The MIVCA clinic was held at Midland HS on February 24-25. The theme was "MAC Attack" and the WMU and CMU volleyball staffs were the lead clinicians and several other college and HS coaches also presented.

There was a wide range of topics on the court and in the classroom for both boys and girls volleyball. Coach Laura Cleveland was inducted into the Hall of Fame.



The MHSFCA recently selected 16 aspiring head coaches and coordinators to take part in the Leadership Development Alliance program in June. The course, designed after the AFCA's prestigious 35 Under 35 program, is a multi-day, intensive program designed to assist with the professional development of coaches focused on leadership and mentorship while giving them unique access to some of the top coaches and administrators that Michigan has to offer.

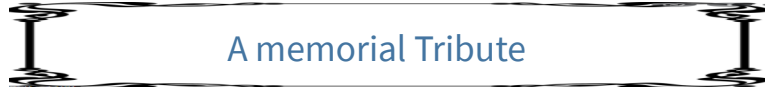

Thomas George Spas was born in Monroe, Michigan, on July 15, 1954. Tom attended Monroe Catholic Central High School, graduating with the class of 1972. He continued his education at Monroe County Community College, obtaining his associate degree in 1974. He declined a playing contract with Detroit Tigers Baseball, opting instead to pursue his vocation as an educator. Tom enrolled at Eastern Michigan University in Ypsilanti, earning a bachelor's degree in 1976 and his master's degree in 1983. Tom's life revolved around education and sports. He began his teaching tenure in 1976 at Monroe St. John Grade School, where he taught seventh and eighth grade, coached volleyball and softball, and was the program director for the Monroe Family YMCA. After two years of teaching grade school, he returned to his alma mater, Monroe Catholic Central, and St. Mary Academy. With an impressive career spanning various roles and responsibilities, Tom's journey as an athletic director showcases his exceptional dedication and expertise. He embarked on this path by serving as the Athletic Director at Monroe Catholic Central, where he excelled in this role and shared his extensive knowledge as a teacher in English, Physical Education, and Health. In addition, his coaching prowess extended to football, basketball, baseball, and track & field. Tom's impact went beyond the athletic realm, as he also assumed Attendance Director and Locker Room Club moderator positions while actively participating in the SMA Athletic Parent Group. In 1985, he embraced new challenges as the Assistant Principal for Monroe Catholic Central, which continued after the consolidation with St. Mary Academy. During this period, his responsibilities broadened to encompass being Athletic Director and Physical Education and Health teacher, overseeing building and grounds, serving as Transportation Director, acting as the Booster Club Moderator, and coaching tennis, golf, and wrestling. Tom's devotion and tireless efforts had a profound impact on the athletic department and student-athletes. His meticulous planning, staging, and creation of various community and donor pro-

gramming were instrumental in securing millions of dollars in contributions to enhance athletic programs and provide valuable opportunities for students. However, his journey didn't end there. He later assumed the role of Executive Director of the Huron League, a position he held until his retirement in 2021. As the league's Executive Director, he oversaw the scheduling of all athletic sporting events, demonstrating exceptional organizational skills and a commitment to promoting athletic excellence throughout the league. Tom's career as an athletic director is a testament to his unwavering dedication and ability to excel in various capacities, leaving an indelible mark on the institutions and communities he served. Tom was a member of the National Interscholastic Athletic Administrators Association, where he became a National Certified Athletic Administrator in 1999, the Michigan Association of Pupil Transportation, the Michigan Association of Secondary Principals, and the Michigan Interscholastic Athletic Administrators Association. Tom earned several awards throughout his illustrious teaching and administrative career. He was awarded the Monroe Family YMCA Youth Service Award in 1976. In 1999 he attained National Certified Athletic Administrator status and was named the Michigan Interscholastic Athletic Administrators Association Athletic Director of the Year. He received the 2006 Monroe Rotary Club Service Above Self Award. Tom was inducted into the St. Mary Catholic Central High School Athletic Hall of Fame in 2015. When Tom found moments of respite from coaching, teaching, and attending sporting events, he took pleasure in working around the yard, nurturing and tending to his beloved garden. In the company of his wife, Alice, he cherished the simple joys of dining out together, sharing meals, and creating cherished memories at various local establishments. Tom, aged 68, peacefully passed away

on Sunday, May 14, 2023, in the comfort of his home, cradled in his wife's arms, following a prolonged illness. He was surrounded by his loving family and received care from Hospice of Michigan. His parents preceded his passing. A Celebration of Tom's Life will be held from 11:00 am to 3:00 pm on Saturday, May 27th, at 129 Lounge on Front Street in Monroe, MI. In addition, Participant/Accident Coverage is required for coaches and/or participants. Should an accident occur during a camp, clinic or event, this secondary coverage helps offset the loss suffered by families affected by such accidents.

### NEW PROCEDURE FOR CAMP INSURANCE

As a member benefit of your state coaches association, all members in good standing have a \$1,000,000 per occurrence General Liability policy limit that provides coverage for their coaching activities. In order to protect the General Liability policy from potential claims, the insurance company has mandated that all coaches must obtain signed waivers and provide Participant/Accident insurance for their participants.

In order to obtain a certificate of insurance showing proof of insurance or naming an additional insured, the following must be in place:

- ❖ **Waivers:** Signed waivers showing indemnification language
- ❖ **Participant/Accident Insurance:** You must have Participant/Accident coverage in place for all participants attending sports camps.

## MHSCA Membership Benefits

- **Sport Association Voice:** The MHSCA provides member sport associations another vehicle of communication with the MHSAA. Each year the MHSCA makes a presentation to the MHSAA Representative Council representing issues of our association members.
- **Coaching Longevity Awards:** Beginning with 10 years of coaching and ascending every 5 years, coaches receive recognition for their years of coaching (10-25 years earn certificates, 30-45 years receive plaques, and at 50 years a coach will receive a special crystal recognition).
- **MHSCA Coach of the Year Recognition:** Each year one coach from your association is chosen by your association to be recognized at the MHSCA State Coach of the Year for your sport.
- **MHSCA Hall of Fame:** Each year up to 15 coaches from the state are selected for induction into the MHSCA Hall of Fame. The Hall is an actual physical entity that is located on the campus of Central Michigan University within the Student Activity Center at the entrance of the old Rose Arena. In addition to meeting the established criteria the individual's sport association must be a member association within the MHSCA.
- **MHSCA Jack Johnson Distinguished Service Award:** One person per year (teacher, coach, administrator, other) nominated by a member sport association will be honored at the September Hall of Fame banquet for outstanding service to high school sports in Michigan.
- **NOCAD Insurance:** As a membership benefit, coverage is provided by the Commercial General Liability Policy issued to the National Organization of Coaches Association Directors (NOCAD). This policy provides \$1,000,000 (\$2,000,000 aggregate) per member liability coverage to only members of the Michigan High School Coaches Association that pay for the additional coverage through MHSCA member sport associations. \*\* New members taking the NOCAD insurance liability coverage are covered on the first date that they pay their membership dues to their sport association through August 1. Members whose sport association paid their for their insurance coverage the previous year are covered August 1—August 1 if they become members of their sport association and their sport association pays their insurance premium. For \$6.00 per coach per year this coverage is hard to match. Members find more detailed information on the [mhsca.org](http://mhsca.org) website in the "Coaches Corner" drop down link titled "Insurance."
- **Rich Tompkins Multi-Sport Award:** This award recognizes athletes that have participated in at least 3 MHSAA sports per year for the 4 years of high school. All nominees receive a high quality certificate. One boy and one girl from each of the four classes of schools (A, B, C, D) will receive a plaque and a scholarship (if eligible) as the MHSCA Rich Tompkins State Multi-Sport Athlete of the Year.
- **Gatorade Supplies:** Member sport associations receive Gatorade give-away supplies to use at their clinics or all-star games.
- **National Federation of High Schools Coach of the Year Recognition:** Each year one coach from your association is nominated by your sport association through the MHSCA to be considered for state and national level recognition.
- As a member of the MHSCA you also receive membership into the National High School Athletic Coaches Association (NHSACA) with membership benefits available.
- **NHSACA Coach of the Year Recognition:** Each year one coach from your sport association can be nominated through the MHSCA for consideration for regional and national recognitions.
- **NHSACA Hall of Fame:** The MHSCA is allowed to select two coaches each year for induction into the National High School Athletic Coaches Association Hall of Fame.
- **NHSACA Kathy Holloway Women in Sports Leadership Award:** Presented annually to a female that has promoted female athletics by coaching, serving, supporting, and/or leading high school athletic programs. The nomination process runs through the MHSCA.
- **NHSACA Distinguished Service Award:** The MHSCA has the opportunity to have one of their members receive this award every 4th year.

This can be at any level. You cannot however count more than one level or season for a sport in any one year.

For example, coaching both boys' and girls' basketball during the same school year counts as "1" year; coaching both 7<sup>th</sup> grade boys and JV boys during the same school year counts as "1" year.

Awards for 30 years and more will have the sports that the candidate coached listed on the plaque. The coach will be presented only one award for each level of service after 30 years.

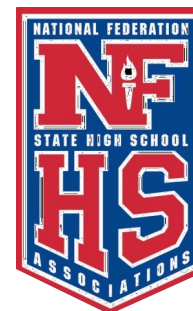
